PASA Executive Feedback

Now to some key feedback and information points from your executive:

- 1. The last PASA executive meeting was held on the 3rd of September where we discussed the financial standing of the organisation, the plan for development and tours and the selection process for selectors and coaches. We will touch on some of these in the newsletter, and formal communication will be distributed around the processes put in place.
- 2. The AGM is planned to be held via Zoom on the 4th of December 2020. I really do encourage everyone to attend this session. Please also be reminded that all provinces and clubs need to have their AGM's before this date.
- 3. I understand that many players are patiently awaiting feedback on the membership fees for 2021 after a season of non-play. This will be discussed in an open forum at the AGM in December.
- 4. The Exec has spent a lot of time on the terms of references of all positions held on the PASA executive. These are important so that all players understand the roles and responsibilities and are able to channel their feedback through the correct portfolios. All ToR's will soon be available on the new website platform for members only.
- 5. During this process the standard operating procedures and protocols for the coaching and selecting portfolios have been established and finalised. You will have received the nomination forms for the specific positions via mail.
- 6. Planned tournaments and tours for 2021 are still very much in the air. We will be having a planning meeting in November to do what preliminary allocation we can in the hopes of an uninterrupted season.
- 7. Karen Cocker in her role as International liaison Officer has had communications with New Zealand as well as our northern neighbours. These communications are on a senior level as well as some age groups.
- 8. However, we have decided to get a jump start on the process of selecting the national coaches for 2021 to allow coaching structures to be put in place while COVID may possible still be causing some chaos
- 9. PASA has been in communications with the IPC to ascertain if the World Cup will remain in the same year or will it be moved out a year as a result of the season interruptions. There is no clarity on this matter as of now.
- 10. The Tournament/Member and Horse registry platform has now been finalised. This is accessible through the website portal and the executive is keen to run a tournament/practice soon using this platform. This will be compulsory next year and therefore I suggest all members become familiar with this platform, especially the Club secretaries as they will be entering teams using the tool. Members/Managers will have do all PASA/ Provincial and Club payments on the system from 2021 onwards.
- 11. A short list of all PASA Trophies has been made and we are trying desperately to track down the trophies that are missing. We are in the process of cleaning these up and having any repairs done before the new season. If any member has a trophy or is aware of the whereabouts of a trophy please let Ashleigh Shaw know. These trophies are extremely valuable to PASA and it is imperative that we look after them and honour their history.
- 12. We are in the process of finding a 'storage' home for the PASA trophies where they can be safely kept and displayed. If you have any suggestions, please let Ashleigh know.


